Father Frank Cancro, a priest of the Diocese of Charlotte, has been a professor, retreat master, writer and preacher. Currently the pastor of Queen of the Apostles Church in Belmont and a Canon Lawyer, he offers consultation around the country and serves as a judge for the Court of the Archdiocese of Miami. He has been committed to adult learning in the diocese for almost 30 years and enjoys sharing insight into the scriptures.

While all of the courses below are appropriate for beginners, the three classes taught by Sr. Mary Hugh Mauldin are geared towards the beginner and are great "primers", (but not pre-requisites) for the two scripture studies taught by Fr. Frank Cancro and Abbott Placid Solari, OSB as well as future scripture studies. Summer is a great time for reading. Why not let the bible be on this summer's "must read" list!

S-1 An Introduction to Scripture*

Mondays, June 13 & 20 • 7:00 to 8:30pm

Scripture is sacred writing. All religions have them. What makes a book "sacred"? What keeps the bible a best-seller? How is Scripture connected to our Catholic teaching? Come and see how reading Scripture can enhance your spiritual life and your growth as a Catholic Christian.

S-2 Survey of the Old Testament*

This course offers a broad view of the 46 books of scripture important to both Judaism and Christianity. What do these ancient books and the stories within, teach us about the nature, character and qualities of the God who longs to be in relationship with us? What do these ancient writings mean for Catholic Christians today?

S-3 Survey of the New Testament*

This course will offer a broad view of the 27 foundational documents of Christianity that proclaim Jesus Christ. Learn what the early Christians wanted us to know of Jesus from their accounts and experience the passion with which they shared His Good News with the world around them.

S-4 "There's Nothing to Fear, Underdog Is Here!": A Study of Luke and Acts of the Apostles*

The Gospel of Luke introduces us to characters who soothe the psyche of the first Christians and who used this inspired text as a way to learn the faith. The writer shows just who can be a messenger of God and a minister of the Good News. This course will give an overview of the Gospel and its themes. It will assist with shaping the tools of the heart and mind to break open this Word and its profound message to us here and now.

S-5 "Heirs of God and Co-heirs with Christ": St. Paul's Letter to the Romans*

This course will offer a brief introduction to St. Paul, his life and letters. The principle focus will be a study of the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul's great treatise on the relation of the Law and grace to salvation. We will examine the Apostle's teaching as expounded in this letter, and consider as well the importance of Romans for the development of the Church's teaching on Original Sin, the Holy Spirit, and the relationship of the Church to Israel.

Location: New Life Center

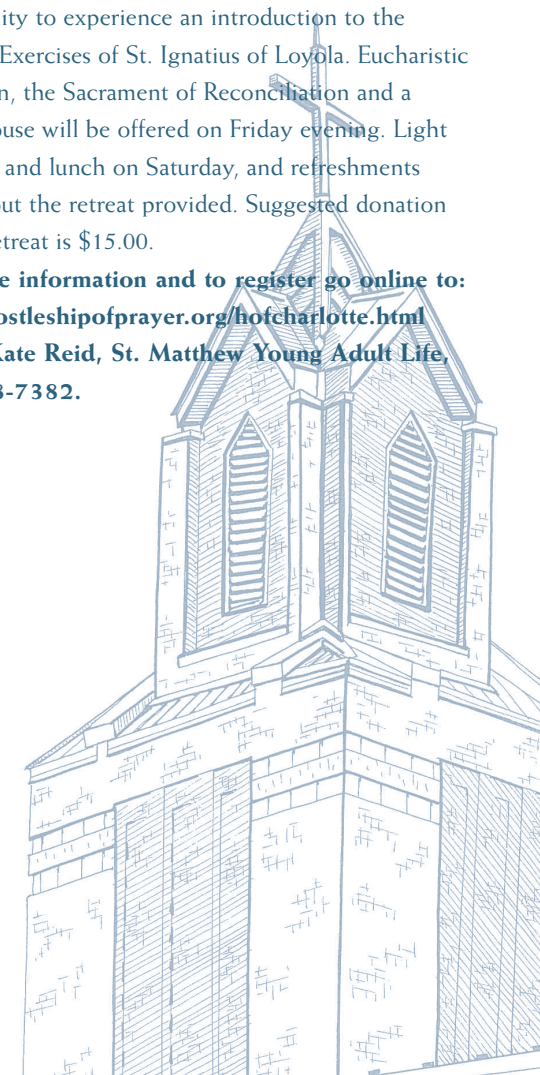
